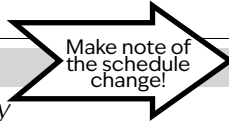

DIocese ANNOUNCES 'SISTER PARISH' PROGRAM

CHARLOTTE — As the Diocese of Charlotte's Helene response efforts shift from emergency aid to long-term rebuilding, Bishop Michael Martin is calling on parishes to form "sister" partnerships for at least the next six months.

Even if their church buildings suffered only minor damage, western North Carolina parishes will face continued "fallout," Bishop Martin noted in an Oct. 10 email to the diocese's 160 priests.

"While some of the immediate needs have been cared for, our longer-term walking with the people affected ... remains an important ministry of our local Church," the bishop said.

The key, he said, is for the diocese to band together to provide long-term material and spiritual support to the affected parishes and communities — accompanying them through the challenges of disaster recovery, "making a difference in that process in the months to come."

In the program announced by the bishop, partnered parishes can hold second collections to help offset lost operating revenue in their sister parish, offer monthly Holy Hours to pray for their sister parish, check in with the parish regularly about the need for pastoral help or volunteers,

and more.

Parishes are asked to sign up for the program, with the chancery pairing up parishes based on resources and level of need. The hope, Bishop Martin said, is for multiple parishes to help each of the impacted communities.

Monsignor Patrick Winslow, who has piloted much of the diocese's storm response, recently consulted with Church leaders in Louisiana who went through Hurricane Katrina. In a recent letter to priests, he shared sobering news that people's emotional recovery from the storm will likely take a year. Survivors of Katrina, the most catastrophic storm on record in the U.S., described three phases of recovery after the storm as

"Respond, Reopen, Recover," focusing first on immediate needs, then on short-term and long-term needs. "As priests and deacons who have served in these regions, we have observed with shock and sadness the images that are now being shared," said Monsignor Winslow, the diocese's vicar general and chancellor who previously served mountain parishes in Tryon and Sparta. "There are a number of pastoral challenges that lie ahead ... since the relief efforts will be going on for some time and the human toll will take even longer to address."

LA DIÓCESIS ANUNCIÓ EL PROGRAMA "PARROQUIAS ASOCIADAS"

CHARLOTTE - A medida que la diócesis de Charlotte pasa de ayuda de emergencia a reconstrucción a largo plazo, el obispo Michael Martin hace un llamado a las parroquias para que formen colaboraciones con parroquias «hermanas» por los próximos seis meses.

Incluso si los edificios de sus iglesias sólo sufrieron daños menores, las parroquias del oeste de Carolina del Norte se enfrentarán a continuas "efectos," señaló el Obispo Martin en un correo electrónico enviado el 10 de octubre a los 160 sacerdotes de la diócesis.

"Aunque algunas de las necesidades inmediatas ya han sido atendidas, nuestro acompañamiento a largo plazo con las personas afectadas... sigue siendo un ministerio importante de nuestra Iglesia", dijo el obispo.

Dijo que la clave, es que la diócesis se unirá para proporcionar apoyo a largo plazo en lo material y espiritual, a las parroquias y comunidades afectadas, acompañándolos en los retos de la recuperación del desastre, "creando la diferencia en ese proceso en los próximos meses."

En el programa anunciado por el obispo, las parroquias asociadas pueden realizar segundas colectas para ayudar a compensar la pérdida de ingresos operativos en su parroquia hermana, ofrecer Hora Santa mensualmente para rezar por su parroquia hermana, consultar regularmente con la parroquia para ver cual es la necesidad de ayuda pastoral o de voluntarios, y mucho más.

Se le pide a las parroquias que se inscriban al programa y la oficina de cancillería emparejara las parroquias basadas en recursos y el nivel de necesidad. La esperanza, dijo el obispo Martin, es que varias parroquias ayuden a cada una de las comunidades afectadas.

Monseñor Patrick Winslow, que ha dirigido gran parte de la respuesta a la tormenta de la diócesis, recientemente consultó con líderes de parroquias en Louisiana que pasaron por el huracán Katrina. Recientemente en una carta a los sacerdotes, Monseñor Winslow compartió noticias inquietantes de que la recuperación emocional de la gente tras la tormenta tomará aproximadamente un año. Sobrevivientes de Katrina, la tormenta más catastrófica registrada en EE.UU., describieron tres fases de recuperación tras la tormenta como

"Responder, Reabrir, Recuperar", enfocándose primero en las necesidades inmediatas y luego en las necesidades a corto y largo plazo.

"Como sacerdotes y diáconos que hemos servido en estas regiones, hemos observado con tristeza y conmoción las imágenes que se están compartiendo", dijo Monseñor Winslow, vicario general y canciller de la diócesis, que anteriormente sirvió en parroquias en las montañas en Tryon y Sparta. "Hay muchos retos pastorales que tenemos por delante ... ya que las operaciones de ayuda seguirán por algún tiempo y la aflicción humana tardará aún más".

La parroquia hermana de Santa Dorotea es Santa Margarita de Escocia en Maggie Valley. Tendremos una segunda colecta cada mes por los próximos seis meses para ayudar a la parroquia durante su tiempo de recuperación. Por favor manténgan a ellos y a todas las otras parroquias afectadas por el Huracán Elena en sus oraciones.

Let us pray for the needs of our brothers and sisters. In your charity, please remember these intentions.

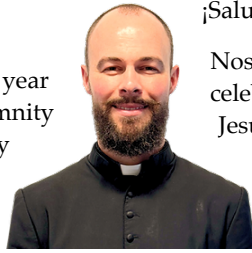

Wisdom from Father Carlson/ Sabiduría del Padre Carlson

Greetings in Christ!

We are quickly coming to the end of the liturgical year which we will celebrate next Sunday with the Solemnity of Jesus Christ King of the Universe. Immediately following, the Church will begin the season of Advent to prepare us to relive the first coming of Christ with His birth in Bethlehem.



¡Saludos en Cristo!

Nos acercamos rápidamente al final del año litúrgico que celebraremos el próximo domingo con la Solemnidad de Jesucristo Rey del Universo. Inmediatamente después, la Iglesia iniciará el tiempo de Adviento para prepararnos a revivir la primera venida de Cristo con su nacimiento en Belén.

With that in mind, the readings for Mass encourage us to reflect on His second coming. When, “He will come again to judge the living and the dead,” as we profess in the Apostle’s Creed. We may not be present during Our Lord’s second coming, however, each one of us will meet Him for our particular judgment after we pass on from this life.

As we prepare to conclude this church year, now is a perfect time for us to consider any attachments to sin that we may still have. Or for that matter, any aspect of our lives that is not pleasing to God and would sadly keep us from Him. We also might consider the quality of our confessions when we come to celebrate that sacrament for the forgiveness of our sins. Do I presume on God’s mercy in the sacrament? Or do I really intend to amend my ways and to go and sin no more?

The remedy for both clinging to sins, as well as presuming on God’s mercy without trying to change, is to develop a real devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These devotions help us to realize that when we sin, we do so against a Divine Person. One who has a relationship with us and one who loves us far beyond what we can imagine. When we sin, we break our Lord’s heart. In contrast, whatever good we do gives Him great joy.

Pope Francis reminds us in his recent encyclical *Dilexit Nos* on the human and divine love of the Heart of Jesus Christ, “The wounded side of Christ continues to pour forth that stream which is never exhausted, never passes away, but offers itself time and time again to all those who wish to love as He did.” (No. 219).

As we near the end of this liturgical year, my particular prayer for you and for our parish is that we would come to better know the love that Jesus has for each one of us and respond to that love with a true desire to offer our lives in service to Him.

Now that we have begun the pledge solicitation phase of our Capital Campaign, expect a call or a visit from a fellow parishioner in the next few weeks. Please treat and welcome them with the charity of Christ, as they are giving of their time and talent for the good of our parish family.

También podríamos considerar la calidad de nuestras confesiones cuando venimos a celebrar este sacramento para el perdón de nuestros pecados. ¿Presumo la misericordia de Dios en el sacramento? ¿O tengo realmente la intención de mejorar y no pecar más?

El remedio para no aferrarse a los pecados, tanto como dejar de presumir la misericordia de Dios sin intentar cambiar, es desarrollar una verdadera devoción al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús y al Inmaculado Corazón de María. Estas devociones nos ayudan a entender de que cuando pecamos, lo hacemos contra una Persona Divina. Una Persona Divina que tiene una relación con nosotros y que nos ama mucho más allá de lo que nos podemos imaginar. Cuando pecamos, rompemos el corazón de nuestro Señor. Por lo contrario, todo lo bueno que hacemos le da una gran alegría.

El Papa Francisco nos recuerda en su reciente encíclica *Dilexit Nos* sobre el amor humano y divino del Corazón de Jesucristo: «El costado herido de Cristo sigue derramando como un arroyo que nunca se agota, nunca muere, sino que se ofrece una y otra vez a todos los que desean amar como Él». (n. 219).

A medida que nos acercamos al final de este año litúrgico, mi oración en particular para ustedes y para nuestra parroquia es que lleguemos a conocer mejor el amor que Jesús tiene por cada uno de nosotros y respondamos a ese amor con un verdadero deseo de ofrecer nuestras vidas a su servicio.

Ahora que hemos comenzado la fase de solicitud de promesas de nuestra Campaña Capital, recibirán una llamada o una visita de un feligrés en las siguientes semanas.
